2020 Monthly Programs

January 16- Annual Meeting. Election of officers, awards, followed by a short presentation by Carol Stetzer: "One or Two Lily Johnsons: A Common Name Case Study." Common names are one of the biggest challenges to genealogical research, particularly when complete documents are not available. This short case study presents the question of whether two cousins married the same woman or whether there were actually two different women with the same common name.

February 20 - "A Can of Worms – Researching Calamity Jane" by Glenda Bell. A legend in her own lifetime, "Calamity Jane" is woven into the fabric of the American West. The historical record is murky, filled with contradictions, exaggerations and confusion.

March 19- "GenSmarts-Your Personal Genealogical Research Assistant!" by Del Ritchhart. GenSmarts is an application that interacts with your genealogy program and provides research suggestions using artificial intelligence analysis. The presentation will familiarize you with the capabilities of GenSmarts, demonstrate some of the major features of the application, and provide tips on using the program in conjunction with online research and trips to libraries, archives and other repositories.

April 16- "Care and Conservation of Treasures Worn or Owned by Your Ancestors" by Paulette Reading. More to follow!

May 21- "Remember and Honor" by Brad Hoopes. Everybody has a unique story, sometimes they are just waiting for someone to ask them to tell it. Brad will share some of the stories he has collected from many veterans, as well as some suggestions for how to collect your own stories from family members.

June 18- "American Women in the 19th Century" by Sylvia Tracy-Doolos. America in the 19th century saw geographic, cultural, and historic changes that affected the records that were created. While this was true for all Americans, it was especially true for women. Sylvia will look broadly at the 19th century to understand the changes in women's lives and the records created.
