January 16: Annual Meeting. Election of officers, awards, followed by a short presentation by Carol Stetzer: "One or Two Lily Johnsons: A Common Name Case Study." Common names are one of the biggest challenges to genealogical research. This short case study presents the question of whether two cousins married the same woman or whether there were actually two different women with the same common name.

February 20: "A Can of Worms – Researching Calamity Jane" by Glenda Bell. A legend in her own lifetime, "Calamity Jane" is woven into the fabric of the American West. The historical record is murky, filled with contradictions, exaggerations and confusion.

March 19: "GenSmarts-Your Personal Genealogical Research Assistant!" by Del Ritchhart. GenSmarts is an application that interacts with your genealogy program and provides research suggestions using artificial intelligence analysis.

April 16: "The ABC's of Sharing Memories Across Generations" by Elaine McAllister. Elaine provides useful tips using each letter of the alphabet in writing or publishing your family history.

May 21: "Remember and Honor" by Brad Hoopes. Brad will share some of the stories he has collected from many WWII veterans, as well as some suggestions for how to collect your own stories from family members.

June 18: "American Women in the 19th Century" by Sylvia Tracy-Doolos. America in the 19th century saw geographic, cultural, and historic changes that affected the records that were created. Sylvia will look broadly at the 19th century to understand the changes in women's Zoom Online s and the records created.

July 16: "Family History Library and Wiki" by Judy Jones. The Family History Library is the largest genealogical library in the world. The library holds genealogical records for over 110 countries, territories, and possessions. Its research wiki receives over 100 million views per year.

August 20: "Keeping up with the Genealogical Buzz" by Kathy Tarullo. You can keep up on the latest genealogy buzz with just a few specific Internet sites including tweets, blogs, newsletters, RSS feeds, social media, podcasts, and webinars.

September 17: "Care and Preservation of Treasures Worn or Owned by Your Ancestors" by Marina Hayes. Textile collections such as quilts, embroideries, historic garments, and flags to be reviewed and recommendations for storage, display, maintenance (such as cleaning), and when to call a conservator.

October 15: "Homestead National Monument, It's Historical Significance and Accessing Homestead Records" by Jonathan Fairchild. Jon will give a presentation on the Homestead National Monument, its historical significance and on utilizing homesteading records for genealogical research.

November 19: "Probate Records – My Favorite Record Type" by Randy Seaver. The overall probate process, the different kinds of probate records, and how to find and obtain probate records in repositories and online record collections to be discussed.
