## **LCGS 2021 Monthly Programs**

### **Zoom Online Broadcast Only for All programs through December!**

**January 21:** Annual Meeting. Election of officers, awards, followed by a short presentation on **WikiTree** by pro genealogist Mags Gaulder. WikiTree is a global family tree with one profile per person who ever lived.

**February 18: Evernote - An invaluable Resource for Filing and Organizing Your Genealogical Records** by Del Ritchhart. The presentation is designed to show what Evernote will do and how to do it.

**March 18: An Introduction to Heraldry for Genealogists** by David Appleton. This presentation shows the connection between genealogy and heraldry, and demonstrates with examples and how heraldry can become "the genealogist's most colorful tool."

**April 15: Naturalization Records** by Joan Grady. The presentation consists of the process, samples of historical papers, what parts of the process provides genealogical information and where copies can be obtained.

**May 20: Getting the Details Right** by Ed Storey. This presentation will help people be accurate with their family trees. It includes examples of how records can lead the investigator astray as well as clues to watch for that can alert the researcher to be extra careful.

**June 17: Prepare for a Research Trip** by Kelli Bergheimer. The presentation focuses on learning strategies to prepare for your trip to research at a library or archive. Use a simple plan before you go to maximize efficiency while you are there.

**July 15: Spies Among Us** by Debra Dudek. Learn how a mass collective of middle class private citizens helped the FBI collect information on non-US citizens during the Great War, and how to track down the files these investigations left behind.

**August 19: History of Mountain Home Cemetery, Fort Collins, CO** by Lyn Iannuzzi. The presentation will cover the Mountain Home Cemetery Historic Records Project and the controversial seventy-five year history, 1873-1947.

**September 16: For Better or Worse: Marriage, Separation and Divorce** by Carol Darrow. Marriage, separation and divorce have shaped the lives of all of our ancestors and their descendants. What started out as a dream of love and happiness may have turned into a nightmare of arguments, separation, divorce or desertion.

**October 21: Advanced Research in Passenger Arrival Records** by Julie Miller. Passenger arrival records are the link that connects the old country to the new and completes a chain of events for our ancestors.

**November 18: Locating Records in Archives from Your Couch** by Sara Cochran. The Digital age has brought billions of records to genealogists' living rooms. Learn how to track down these valuable resources, wherever they are in the world, without leaving the comfort of your own home.
